The Guide to Developing Collegiate Jaycee Chapters is designed to provide an overview of the Collegiate Jaycee Chapter, it's role as a Jaycees family member, JCI affiliate (Junior Chamber International), and the benefits it can provide to the school and community. Reading the booklet will help a school student activities director or a Jaycee chapter understand how the Jaycees can play an important role in the development of a college/university student's positive self-esteem, leadership growth, and getting them more actively involved in campus activities.

- Plan and maintain a balance of service projects and social activities as a club.
- Assign all club members to a committee to encourage participation.
- Collegiate Jaycee chapters are student led organizations
- Don't give up! It will take several months and persistence to start a new organization on a college campus.
- Once you have an interest from college students, then start activities immediately – don't wait until your membership reaches a preset level to start having meetings and social functions. Once you've reached the required 20 members for a collegiate chapter; then design a plan for the first year of the chapter.
